REGISTERING ON MEETING MANAGER

BOOKING YOUR HOTEL ROOM AT THE HOLIDAY INN HOTEL, BANGKOK

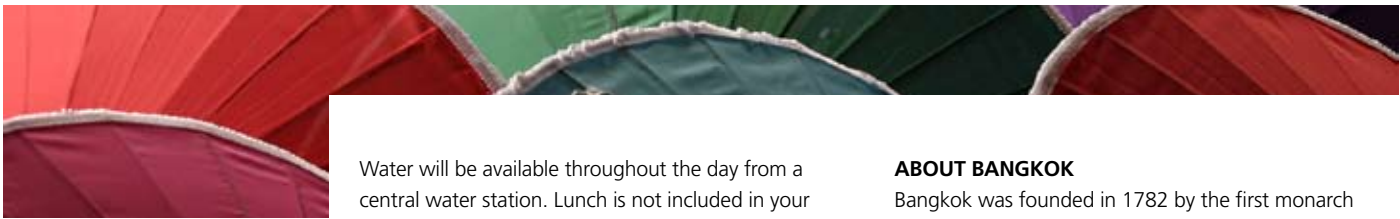
GETTING AROUND
